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
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Dear Parents/Carers,

It is nearly World Book Day again! This year, due to school photographs, we will be dressing up on Friday 6th of March.



We like to celebrate at St Peter and St Paul by dressing up as our favourite book characters. Please try to ensure that your child chooses a book rather than a film character. Comic book characters are acceptable. Teachers will be looking for costumes that reflect the children's reading. Costumes do not need to be expensive or professionally made. A child in each class will receive a book token as a prize for the best presentation and costume.

It is important that your child knows the character in their book well and they can explain why they are dressed as him/her/it. Something like: *I have chosen Jack from Jack in the Beanstalk because even though he makes a mistake, he is brave. I would also really like to climb a beanstalk like him.* Help your child think about what it is about the character that really appeals to them. Is it their personality, their adventures or something else? Encourage your child to bring in a copy of the book in which the character features, or a picture of the character to share.
